

Pinatubo eruption but has quickly recovered in a year's time. The hotel with cluster of homes inside the perimeter is well-secured wherein gate crashing is minimized.

Pete Cunag with assistance from 10 resident brods and sis, did a splendid job for their meticulous planning — putting in place all the programs, decors, signages, entertainment, bands, marketing and promoting this milestone among the residents and alumni members in our Viber Chat Group.
