FROM MY POINT OF VIEW

Fil-American History Month Was Proclaimed and Celebrated In Cities Across Southern California

Cerritos, Calif. The Filipino-American History Month in the United States was proclaimed by President Joe Biden in October. Taking a cue from this pronouncement, California Congresswoman Michelle Steel (R-California 45th District) and Rep. Ed Case (D-Hawaii 1st District) principally authored a bicameral resolution celebrating in October the history and culture of Filipino American and their immense contributions to the United States. This was followed by the City of Los Angeles, Cerritos and Carson and other cities in the United States where there are large concentration of Filipino-Americans.

On October 26, the City Council of Cerritos presented a proclamation to the Filipino community with the participation of the Filipino American Chamber of Commerce of Cerritos and *Magkaisa* Club of Cerritos High School — at the Cerritos City Council Chamber led by its Mayor Bruce Barrows, Chuong Vo, Naresh Solanki and Fil-Am council members Lynda Johnson and Frank Aurelio Yokoyama.

Mayor Barrows in his opening statement said, “On Sept. 29, 2023, Congresswoman Michelle Steel submitted House Resolution 744, which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Accountability. This recognizes the month of October 2023 as Filipino American History Month and celebrates the history and culture of Filipino Americans and their immense contributions to the United States. The Filipino American community is the third-largest Asian American and Pacific Islander group in the United States, with a population of approximately 4,500,000.”

California is home to nearly 2 million Filipinos, approximately 30,000 of which live in California’s 45th District according to U.S. Census Data.

He added, “According to the 2021 American Community Survey, the Filipino Community is the largest of the Asian population in the City of Cerritos.” With about 50,000 residents in the City, Filipino-American residents account for 7,383.

Reading a portion of the House Resolution 744, Mayor Barrows told the gallery of mostly Filipino-Americans clad in their *Filipiniana*

costume, “From the Civil War to the Iraq and Afghanistan conflicts, Filipinos and Filipino Americans have a long-standing history of serving in the Armed Forces of the United States.”

It will be noted that more than 250,000 Filipinos fought as USAFFE forces and guerrillas under the United States flag during the World War II to protect and defend the U.S. interests in the Pacific Theater. “Filipino Americans have received the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force that may be bestowed on an individual serving in the Armed Forces, and continue to demonstrate a commendable sense of patriotism and honor in the Armed Forces.”

According to the resolution, “Filipino Americans play an integral role in the healthcare system of the United States as nurses, doctors, first responders, and other medical professionals, and approximately 1 in 4 working Filipino adults in the United States is a frontline healthcare worker.

“In 2009, Congress first recognized October as Filipino American History Month for their many contributions including music, dance, literature, education, business, hospitality, journalism, sports, fashion, politics, government, science, technology, the fine arts, and other fields that enrich the United States. For the many contributions of Filipino and Filipino Americans, it is fitting that we join with our nation and celebrate the month of October as Filipino American History Month and honor our Filipino community members.”

Accepting the proclamation were Ms. Ellen Rodriguez-Swing, President of the Filipino American Chamber of Commerce of Cerritos and its vice chair, Mr. Lee Natividad and Miss Kaitlin Casica, President of Cerritos High School Club *Magkaisa*.

After the passage of the House Resolution during the 118th Congress 1st Session, Rep. Michelle Steel said, “The Filipino Americans in Southern California have contributed so much to our communities. I am proud to introduce this resolution to honor the rich history, culture, and heritage of the Filipinos across this country, to commemorate their successes, and celebrate their commitment to the American Dream.”

“On behalf of the National Federation of Filipino-American Associations (NaFFAA) Greater Los Angeles Region and our constituent-members, we welcome the American community as a whole to help us celebrate Filipino-American History Month during October each year,” said Noel S. V. Omega, President of NaFFAA Greater Los Angeles Region. “This celebration reminds us to work together to break cultural barriers and create a climate of inclusivity, harmony and compassion towards all. We invite everyone to learn about the history and contributions of Filipinos in America. Together, we can build bridges across communities to secure a stronger future as we learn from each other.”

The earliest documented Filipino presence in the continental United States was October 18, 1587, when the first “*Luzones Indios*” arrived in Morro Bay, California, on board the *Nuestra Señora de Esperanza*, a Manila-built galleon ship.

The Filipino American National Historical Society recognizes 1763 as the year in which the first permanent Filipino settlement in the United States was established in St. Malo, Louisiana.
