Granada Hills — Over 40 players joined the face-off between teams North and South to mark the debut of the Dr. Librado I. Ureta Service Cup, which was held at Knollwood Golf and Country Club on August 4-5, 2007. The more seasoned golfers from SFSV AA, NorCal AA and Central Valley AA represented Team North, led by its hole-out captain Bro. Cesar Garingan. They were pitted against the so-called "second best" Team South of ace captain Bro. Tony Gomez, which was composed of players from San Diego AA, South Bay AA and GLAAA. The 2-day ala-Ryder Cup fairway challenge was capped in a combination of best ball and match play formats pairing the players in a tight contest of over 20 flights that ended up in a tie score of 15.5 points each team.

The awarding ceremony and post-game fellowship were held at Bro. Art Franco's residence. Bro. Vinz Argonza was declared *Putting Champion*. *Longest Drive* awards went to Bros. Aris Corpuz (Hole #1), Jimmy Magsino (Hole #4), Ben Dayao (Hole #11) and Paul Villafuerte (Hole #16). *Closest to the Pin* winners were Bros. Bobet Lara (Hole #6), Patrick Afan (Hole #8), Paul Villafuerte (Hole #13) and Mel Cancino (Hole #17). *Low Net* champions were Bros. Mervyn Gucilar (Class A), Erwin Carracedo (Class B) and Art Salum (Class C). The overall lowest gross champion was Bro. Jimmy Magsino, who shot the best score of 77. The perpetual trophy remains with Team South, being the host, until the next match. The tournament was organized and hosted by GLA AA under the leadership of its President, Bro. Sancho Sy, with Bro. Mar Garchitorena as Commissioner and the North and South team captains, and in collaboration with ACNA. Equally successful was the Poker Tournament fundraiser organized by GLA on August 4 after the Day 1 golf match. Splitting the 1st and 2nd prize pot of \$1,400.00 were Bro. Ferdie Laluces and Rissa Nicoles (guest). Other winners were also invited guests. The card game was chaired by Bro. Raul Nadres. Part of the proceeds of the fundraisers will benefit the various service projects of ACNA and GLA.

There was exchange of paddle from APO to Tony Melloto & a shovel from GK to APO. LFS but the common denominator is SERVICE.

Torch and Trefoil will be back in circulation. UP Diliman volunteered to take charge to be published every quarter. Sponsors will be APO members only.

Full implementation of APO pledge program, including anti-hazing. We have 2 brods in Calamba and 3 in Capiz incarcerated due to hazing.

APO building will be home for our NEO, it is a combined National museum and hostel for members. We need to raise funds to accomplish these projects.

1. Sweepstakes draw on 12/6/07. We are looking at 3 to 4 millions proceeds going to the National Council depending on the tickets sold.
2. APO Gold Circuit Quarterly Tournament will start on Dec 6, 2007. AA as sponsor will make 50% of the proceeds as they don't have the expertise to launch their own tournament.
3. APO Visa Card-The only Philippines Bank to issue is Union Bank.

Strathern Yard Gets a Facelift

“Construction Zone: Fines are Double”, says Project Chair Bro. Johnboy Ramos in the early morning of July 28, 2007 at the backyard of Bro. Bonjie Ingco. in San Fernando Valley. He was leading a group of peons whose objective is to fix whatever needs fixing around... be it the guesthouse, the yard, the plants, the trees etc. Handy tools were available to the crew's content; power saw, hammers, chisels, shovels, paint brushes, etc. as the crew was given freedom in parading their individual strengths and expertises.

The guesthouse and the yard were the primary targets, along with the “Olympic size Swimming Pool” that needed to be demolished. The guesthouse got the most love as the crew carefully crafted angles on door and window trimmings. It was fun witnessing Ka WillyC painting the trims in Monet style. Dangling roof trimmings were also secured to the rafters. The Olympic sized pool was single-handedly demolished by Bro.
