APOGLA's 39th Year Service to the Los Angeles Marathon

The LA Marathon celebrated 40 years running on March 16, 2025.

More than 26,000 runners participated in the 26.2 mile course which snaked through the city's iconic landmarks. The race began at Dodgers Stadium passing through Chinatown, Olvera Street, LA City Hall, Little Tokyo, Cathedral of our Lady of Angels, Echo Park Lake, Capitol Records Tower, Hollywood Walk of Fame, Beverly Hills, Rodeo Drive Route 66 and ending at Santa Monica.

Edgar Ninofranco initiated the participation of the association in 1986 and this was the 39th year that APOGLA has served in the famous Marathon and we are still running. To this day, the Sunday LA Marathon is one of the most anticipated and participated family activities of APOGLA which was dedicated and named The Bonjie Ingco Memorial Service Project.

The Mile 13 Water Station is the midway mark of the race and has become APO's annual Sunday Morning party venue. Located along Sunset Boulevard across Laurel Canyon Boulevard, fronting the Laugh Factory with Hollywood Hills in the background, Mile 13 is one happy, noisy, excitement-filled sight to behold. Captain Egay and the team started to arrive at 4:30 in the morning to set up the water tables, the buffet table for breakfast, music and karaoke station and other needs for the runners and volunteers. Pink volunteer t-shirts were distributed. Potluck is the order of the day as each family brought in their favorite breakfast fare to be shared by all volunteers and friends. Donuts, Dinuguan with Puto, Fried Rice, Adobo, sotanghon soup, cookies, kakanin, of course Starbucks coffee, Porto's pastries and many more colorful foods adorn the street buffet table.

When the elite runners started to pass by, Mile 13 became a busy boulevard passing out water cups, cheering the runners and assisting those who needed help and medical aid. Volunteers cheered the thousands of runners, many came in colorful and interesting attire including the throng of Elvis Presley runners and many ran and walked to fulfill their respective goals of achieving their personal best. In the end, perseverance, pride and fun were the ultimate prize for the many runners and bikers who enjoyed the cool, calm, ideal weather and the thousands of fans along the route.

Our very own Brod Jeffrey Guevarra received a rousing welcome at Mile 13 and proceeded to finish with his personal best. APO Kids Therese Carbon, Janine Tarculas, Brod Chowee Sy and sister Petchie Petreaca also completed the gruelling 26.2 mile race.

This year, Matt Richman won the men's race becoming the first American to win the race in 31 years. He finished with a time of 2:07:56. The women's race was won by Tejinesh Gebisa Tulu of Ethiopia with a time of 2:30:16.

At about 11:30 in the morning, when most of the runners had passed the station, the team started to clean and break down the tables with the City cleaning crew and trucks slowly approaching the water stations. Photo opportunities were plentiful and when the final group photo was completed, we proceeded to Sis Bicbic's apartment's hall in Eagle Rock for the GMM

Another service project completed, a sigh of relief and a refreshing feeling of gratefulness for a service well done. Kudos to all the family members, the children, our friends and new found friends on Mile 13. See you all again at the 2026 Los Angeles Marathon!
