THE 37TH ANNUAL LOS ANGELES MARATHON **APOGLA's Bonjie Ingco Service Project**

The 37th staging of the LA Marathon was held on Sunday, March 20, 2022 four months after the last one. Last year's race was moved to November 2021 because of the pandemic. More than 3,000 volunteers and about 15,000 runners participated in the 26.2 mile course which snaked through the city's iconic neighborhoods. The "Stadium to the Stars Race" began at Dodgers Stadium passing through Downtown LA, Little Tokyo, Echo Park, Hollywood, Beverly Hills, Brentwood, Santa Monica and finishing at the Avenue of the Stars in Century City. Edgar Ninofranco initiated the participation of the association in 1986 and this was the 36th year that APOGLA has served in the famed Marathon and we are still running. To this day, the Sunday LA Marathon is one of the most anticipated and participated family activities of APOGLA. It was recently dedicated as *The Bonjie Ingco Service Project* when our beloved brother passed away.

The Mile 13 Water Station is the midway mark of the race and has become APO's annual Sunday Morning party venue. Located along Sunset Boulevard across Laurel Canyon Boulevard, fronting the Laugh Factory with Hollywood Hills in the background, Mile 13 is one happy, noisy, excitement-filled sight to behold. Captain Egay and the team started to arrive at 4:30 in the morning to set up the water tables, the buffet table for breakfast, the DJ Chosy's, Music and Karaoke station and other needs for the runners and volunteers. Volunteer t-shirts were distributed by the team of Rene and Ophel. Potluck is the order of the day as each family brought in their favorite breakfast fare to be shared by all volunteers and friends. Donuts, Dinuguan with Puto, Fried Rice, Adobo, Miswa, cookies, kakanin, of course Starbucks coffee and many more colorful foods adorn the buffet table.

When the elite runners started to pass by, Mile 13 became a busy boulevard passing out water cups, cheering the runners and assisting those who needed help and medical aid. Volunteers took turns at the microphone to belt out their favorite Karaoke tune and cheer on the thousands of runners; many came in colorful and interesting attire and many ran and walked to fulfill their respective goals of achieving their personal best. In the end, Perseverance, Pride and Fun were the ultimate prize for the many runners and bikers who enjoyed the cool, calm, ideal, beautiful weather and the thousands of fans along the route.

We cheered when Santa Clarita runner Nic Montebon, Jr. arrived at Mile 13 as we took photos with him and a short respite and boost on his way to the finish line. Our very own Bodgie Gapido received a rousing welcome at Mile 13 and proceeded to finish with his personal best of a little more than 5 hours. The women's division title went to Devine Moringor of Kenya with a time of 2 hours 25 minutes and 3 seconds and then went on to win the top prize of \$10,000.00 for crossing the finish line first. The men's division champion was John Kovir, also from Kenya, with a time of 2 hours, 9 minutes and 7 seconds. Under marathon rules, elite female runners start the race 16 minutes and 5 seconds before the race.

Sad news dampened the marathon when 46 year old Trisha Paddock of Palos Verdes, a mother of three, was participating in the 13.1 Mile Charity Challenge where all participants were fundraising for one of the race's official charities. She was raising funds for the Asian American Drug Abuse Program which provides Asian Pacific Islanders with substance abuse services throughout Los Angeles County. She collapsed at the finish line and later died.

At about 11:30 in the morning, when most of the runners had passed the station, the team started to clean and break down the tables with the City cleaning crew and trucks slowly approaching the water stations. Photo opportunities were plentiful and when the final group photo was done, we went our separate ways into our respective homes for a well deserved rest and siesta.

Another service project completed, a sigh of relief and a refreshing feeling of gratefulness for a service well done. Kudos to all the family members, the children, our friends and new found friends on Mile 13. See you all again on March 19, 2023 Los Angeles Marathon! Cheers and Mabuhay and APOGLA!

The Alphans old and new gathered for a simple celebration of ACAI's 26th anniversary at the residence of Brod Tony and Sis Ophel Amon.

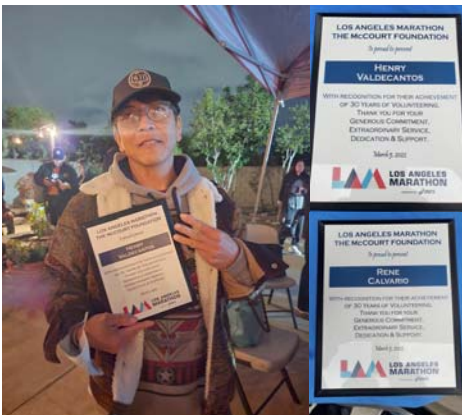
It might have been simple but there was much food, melodic music, pleasantries and oh! so many stories to share!

Always Remember If You Received Stimulus Refund

It has come to my attention that several qualified taxpayers — by either lapse of memory or for some unexplainable reasons — don't realize that they already received their Economic Impact Payment or the Recovery Rebate Credit otherwise known as stimulus refund amounting to \$1,400 under the American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) of the Biden Administration in 2021

This refund either came in the form of IRS check, debit card or was directly deposited to taxpayer's bank account. Even after interviewing them, they insisted that they never received this amount. Thereafter, they complained that after a couple of months, their refunds have not yet been received. After a thorough searching on their bank statement, only then did they realize that they actually received it. Of course, the delay of their refund is inevitable. The Internal Revenue Service had to adjust their refunds minus the \$1,400 for single filers or \$2,800 for married filing jointly. I advise them to check their bank deposits for proofs or accuracy.

- Unknown to many, if you bought an electric or plug-in car in 2021, car buyers of this model can get a credit rebate of \$7,500. This is so-called Alternative Motor Vehicle Credit (Tax Code 8910). Just inform your tax preparer so it can be inputted under Credit Menu. Just provide the year, make and model of the vehicle. This is a large sum of money. It is an incentive coming on the heels of rising gas not only this year but in previous years.
- It is interesting to note that more often than not, our Social Security pension benefit is not taxable. However, if married filing jointly have high income and high tax rate, a portion of this benefit is taxable.
- If you are providing care to a handicapped child or an elderly parent and received the Form W-2 under that person as an employer and you as an employee, this income is non-taxable.
- I advise my clients to monitor and keep their receipts or records of deductible items especially if they are in high income bracket but filing on an itemized deductions like out of pocket or co-pay doctor's visits, prescription medications, church tithings, charitable donations, car registration renewals. Everything counts nowadays. Don't rely on your memory.
- Those with high medical expenses can deduct only certain expenses that exceed 7.5% of their Adjusted Gross Income (AGI).
- When you install a solar panel on your roof to save on electricity, it is tax deductible. Make sure that the credit rebate that you received doesn't go to sellers of this energy solar panels. There are unscrupulous salesmen out there who take advantage of gullible buyers.
- There are times that financial institutions don't specify all the details on statement sent to shareholders. I advise taxpayers to provide complete information like the date they acquired their shares of stocks, the original cost, and the date and price they sold them. This will determine the capital gains which are taxable. Otherwise, you'll pay more taxes on your capital gains.
- And don't forget. If you have gambling winnings, better report them. Casinos provide the IRS your information.
