It has to be noted that most of us were relatively new migrants in this land called America. . These brothers and sisters decided to re-activate and re-commit themselves to do something that will hopefully provide them with some self-satisfaction in an effort to build an organization that can stand the test of time.

We were certain with one thing this time around. Family values shall be the core - front and center. We had to be a family-oriented organization if we were to succeed. While most of us were then unmarried, new immigrants in a foreign land, naïve in many ways so to speak, gradually, we were starting to build families of our own.

Noteworthy to mention, after one of our monthly meetings in early 1985 at Pizza Hut on Beverly Blvd and Normandie in Los Angeles, a few of us proceeded to our late Brother Bonjie Ingco's nearby apartment in Mariposa. It was in that gathering that Brother Christian brought out the idea of a family camping. We got excited!

Being with the US Navy at that time, he offered to provide camping tents for most of us who didn't have one - ten dollars rental per tent. However, he didn't provide nor mentioned to us the need for an air mattress $J\ldots$ For first time campers like Racquel and myself, we didn't know what to expect. We were only sure of one thing though: that it will be exciting and that we were going to have fun in the company of some thirty individuals - including family members. My eldest son Patrick, was then three months old in his mom's pregnancy.

It was a struggle to sleep on a rough and rugged ground with one's back on the tent's canvass floor, that's for sure. No one told us to bring an air mattress! We could only laugh when we look back.

FEEDING AMERICA SERVICE

On Saturday, April 16, 2022, APOGLA returned to render service to the community at the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank. This marks our second service to the community for the year 2022 and was led by Sis Petchi Petreaca.

APOGLA volunteers began the day with a hearty and delicious breakfast of tapa, longganisa, scrambled eggs and rice provided by our Bro VP Roland and Gie Paras. At 9AM, volunteers were ushered into the warehouse for orientation and volunteer assignments. For 4 hours, 38 APOGLA members and family members sorted and packaged shelf-stable goods such as canned goods, beans, peanut butter, pasta distribution to families and individuals facing food insecurity. We helped the LA Regional Food Bank prepare 7,296 kits this day!

APOGLA has been volunteering almost every year at the Los Angeles Food Bank. The Los Angeles Regional Food Bank has worked to


Please mark your calendar. On June 11, we will have our Blood Drive at the Holiday Inn - West Covina. Please invite your friends and family to join us.

REPORT FROM THE ACNA BOARD by Bro/Pres. Roehl Reyes

As I discussed last April 16 GMM, I set up a goal to raise issues regarding ACNA'S CBL and policies. As it turns out, the agenda I planned was chosen over the original meeting agenda.

First, I raised the issue that ACNA for a long time has been violating the CBL by not electing the Chairman of the Board, its Secretary and the Board members 30 days prior to taking office. I successfully convinced the President to appoint the members of the Comelec and that the BOD confirms them before the end of June.

Second, I raised the issue that based on the CBL, the president should appoint the Comelec member and be approved by the Board of Directors six months after the president takes office. Again I successfully had the president appoint the members of the Comelec and the BOD confirm them before the end of June.

Third, I asked that the BOD form a committee that will write the COMELEC guidelines so ACNA'S election will have the same guidelines. It was brought to my attention that there is a guideline written by the last COMELEC. It will be presented to the Board for review and approval.

Lastly, I asked the Board to have an official means of communication. Previously, they were using the messenger but it is a

thread messaging. It was so hard to keep track of multiple conversations. So I proposed using Google group, where there can be multiple email thread. The Board agreed with me and adopted Google group as the official means of communication.



Another item in the agenda was the issue on APO AA's in Montreal. After deliberation, The Board agreed to follow the recommendation of the committee; therefore, the APO Montreal can still continue to exist.

On the other hand, ACNA President Larry Receno presented his budget. Various committees were proposed and approved. Report from the ACNA Council meeting: ACNA'S President, 1st and 2nd VPs, Treasurer, Auditor, and PRO presented their respective reports.

ARNA RD Lemuel Banaga proposed that the ACNA'S President will appoint ARNA RD. This was ignored by the Board.

All AA's presented their reports and of course, our own report was the best report and was the highlight the meeting. Most of GLA attendees supported me during our Report. Everyone applauded and expressed their strong endorsement for us.
